Many careers and college programs involve substantial mathematical prerequisites, and achieving a passing or high score on the math section demonstrates proficiency in mathematical reasoning, logical thinking, and problem solving.

1.1.2 Test Structure and Scoring

The GED Math test consists of around 46 questions, which you are given 115 minutes to complete. The questions come in various formats such as multiple choices, drag-and-drop, fill-in-the-blank, and hot spot (where you select areas of a graphic). The test is divided into two sections:

1. **Part 1 - Calculator Allowed:** You can use an on-screen scientific calculator (TI-30XS Multitier) or bring your own.
2. **Part 2 - Calculator Not Allowed:** You must solve problems without a calculator.

Content Areas:

The GED Math test covers two broad content areas, each making up about half of the test:

Quantitative problem solving (45% of the test): Number operations, number sense, fractions, percent's, and ratios.

When reviewing solutions:

Example:

Suppose the question asks for the solution to

$$2x + 4 = 10$$

Step 1: Subtracting 4 from both sides:

$$2x + 4 - 4 = 10 - 4$$

$$2x = 6$$

Step 2: Dividing both sides by 2:

$$x = \frac{6}{2} = 3$$

Working through practice problems multiple times ensures you fully understand how to approach each type of question.

Track Your Progress: A well-kept log of your practice test scores will help map out your improvements. Take note of the topics in which you consistently perform better and those where you struggle, allowing you to adjust your study plan.

1.2.4 Time Management Approaches

Time management on the GED Math test is critical because it prevents you from rushing at the end or running out of time for questions, you know how to solve. Here are some strategies specifically aimed at optimizing time during the test:

Use Process of Elimination: When you encounter a difficult problem, you might not know the right answer immediately. However, you can use the process of elimination by crossing out answer choices that are clearly wrong. Even if you guess, you will do so with a better probability.

Prioritize Easier Questions: GED Math problems vary in difficulty, but each question is worth the same amount of points. When taking a timed test, focus first on solving questions you find easiest. Skip more difficult problems, but mark them so you can return when time allows.

Watch Your Time: As a rule of thumb, try to allocate no more than 2 minutes per question for the multiple-choice section. Use a watch or the on-screen timer to keep track of the remaining time.
